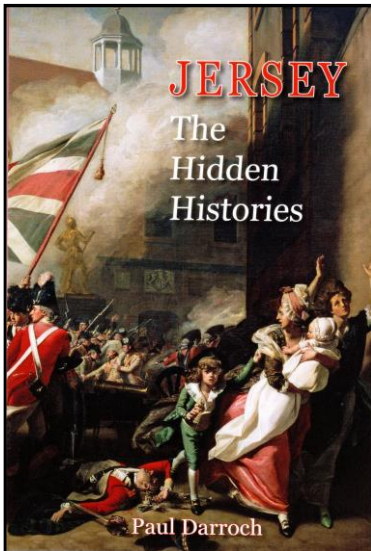

*JERSEY: THE HIDDEN HISTORIES* by Paul Darroch

"History is breaking in. It explodes over the Jersey skies with the force of an electrical storm". *JERSEY: The Hidden Histories* opens with these words as it recounts Jersey's rich and eventful past in the form of a novel. The author, Paul Darroch, who lives in the Island, is a former Centenary Scholar in Modern History at St Hugh's College, Oxford. However, he seeks to tell Jersey's history in a gripping, immersive series of stories, experienced through the eyes of the men and women who lived them.

The histories of Jersey and London are deeply intertwined, and the paths of so many lives are painted on this shared canvas. From Sir Walter Raleigh to the fugitive King Charles; from Lillie Langtry to Elinor Glyn, the same places and connections recur time and again, reaching in many cases to America beyond.

At the February 2018 supper, Paul will bring some of these hidden histories to life. He will open with the story of Charlie Chaplin, whose journey took him from the brutal poverty of south London to the stage of the Jersey Opera House. This was the day before Chaplin joined the Jersey Battle of Flowers parade, when the course of his life would change forever.
